

Badger Bivisible



Recipe

Hook: Mustad: #94840 or #94833 Size: 4-18
Thread: Black, 6/0
Tail: Badger Hackle Fibers
Body: Badger Hackle, palmered the full length of the body.
Face: White Hackle

Tying Tips: Easy pattern to tie. You may tie in an underbody of silver tinsel. Many fishermen Tie them without tails.

Fishing Tips: A high floating attractor fly. Works particularly good in fast water. Hackle may be trimmed on the bottom so that the fly sits lower in the water.

Historical Note: The original bivisible (brown) is attributed to Mr. Edward Hewitt, developed in 1926. The badger bivisible was created in the 1930's by Mr. Charles Merrill of Detroit. He was known as the 'Dean of Detroit's fly tiers,' and the founder of the F.F.F.F. Club (Fine & Fancy Fly Flingers). Mr. Merrill died in 1940.
