

Bicolor Walker

Recipe



Hook: Mustad #94831 Size: 10-14 2XL-3XL
Thread: Black, 8/0
Tail: Pheasant Tail Fibers, tie in a 'V'
Body: Reddish/Brown Yarn, tied with a tuft or loop at the end, that extends beyond the bend of the hook.
Body Wing: Brownish/Gray Deer Hair, tied trude, extended beyond the bend of the hook, tied sparse.
Throat Wing: White Hen Neck, tied spent
Hackle: Brown & Gray, mixed.

Tying Tips: Standard techniques. It may also be tied with a badger wing.

Fishing Tips: Used during the Brown Drake Hatch. Mr. Hanna prefers to use this fly just after dark.

Historical Note: This is Ralph Hanna's most famous pattern. Ralph created this pattern in 1948. This pattern is also called "Hanna's Brown Drake," or the "Biwalker." This fly has erroneously been attributed to Lacey Stephan and Bernie Fowler.
