

# Cornie's Quill



## Recipe

Hook: Mustad #94833 Size 14-24  
Thread: Black, 6/0  
Tail: Brown Hackle Fibers  
Wing: Mallard Flank Feathers, upright & divided.  
Body: Stripped Peacock Herl  
Hackle: Grizzly & Brown, mixed

*Tying Tips:* There is another version tied by the creator using an unstrapped peacock herl body. And still another version using mouse hair for the wings and tying them in spent wing.

*Fishing Tips:* It is very effective if used Little Black Caddis hatches which last most of the season. Use a delicate presentation on a 7X tippet.

*Historical Note:* This fly was originated by Mr. Cornie Schrems of Grand Rapids, MI. Cornie never tied his own flies but rather had them tied by Art Neumann or Dan Bailey. Art Neumann named this fly. Cornie Schrems was present at the original meeting at George Griffith's home, where TU was founded. This fly is also called, 'Schrem's Quill'. This fly was most likely created in the late 1950's or early 1960's.
