

Deer Hair Hex Dun



Recipe

Hook:	Mustad #94831	Size: 4-6
Thread:	Yellow, 6/0	
Tail:	Two moose mane fibers dyed yellowish-brown.	
Wing:	Light Dun Hair Clump, tied post style,	
Body:	Deer Body Hair, dyed olive brown	
Rib:	Yellow thread, wrapped crisscross.	
Hackle:	Grizzly Saddle Hackle, tied parachute	

Tying Tips: Please note the deer hair body is not flared at the tail. I prefer a Mustad #94840 or #94833. Body deer hair can also be dyed yellow brown. I also prefer a dry fly hackle over the saddle hackle.

Fishing Tips: The dun pattern was designed to represent the female *Hexagenia* dun. Best fished on late afternoons on muggy overcast days, during the hex season.

Historical Note: Created by Jim Kane of Michigan. Probably developed mid 1970's or 80's.
