

Deer Hair Popper



Recipe

Hook:	Mustad #94840 or #94833	Sizes: 10-14
Thread:	Black, 6/0	
Tail:	Deer Body Hair Tips, extended from the body.	
Body:	Deer Body Hair	
Hackle:	Coachman Brown	

Tying Tips: Secure a small pinch 20-30 hairs --- tied to the hook shank, tips pointing toward the rear of the hook. Pull back over and tie down again, pull back over again and tie down. The remaining hair extends beyond the hook and becomes the tail. I prefer to lacquer the body. Keep the body plump.

Fishing Tips: This fly is excellent for trout especially when mayflies are hatching and trout are feeding on spent flies. You'll find that this fly also works well on bass and pan fish.

Historical Note: This fly was most probably created by Dr. Samuel E. Lewis, an orthodontist from the Kalamazoo area. Dr. Lewis apparently moved to the Detroit area from the 1920's until after World War II --- then retired back to the Kalamazoo area. Reportedly he had a cabin on the Jordan River. There are a multitude of other flies with the same name. This fly was created in the early 1950's

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
