

Roti's Brown Drake Attractor

Recipe



Hook: Mustad 9671 2XL Size: 10-12
Thread: Brown, 6/0
Tail: Iridescent breast feathers of a wild turkey, 2 to 3 fibers.
Body: Light Cahill or Straw colored dubbing.
Hackle: Badger, tied fore and aft.

Tying Tips: Standard techniques. Tie in sequence – tail, rear hackle, body, front hackle. I prefer a lighter hook so I use a #94831 2XL.

Fishing Tips: Fished during the brown drake hatch. It's designed to be a nymph emerger/dun pattern. Should be fished from dusk until the spinner hatch starts.

Historical Note: This fly was created by Bruno Roti of Baldwin, Michigan in 1982. Fore and aft patterns are not common on Michigan waters, but I have used this for the brown drake hatch for several years now with a good deal of success.
