

Sunset Sulfur



Recipe

Hook: Mustad #94840 or #94833 Sizes: 14-18
Thread: Orange, 6/0
Tail: Light Blue Dun Hackle Fibers
Wing: White Deer Belly Hair, tied post (parachute).
Body: Fly-Rite Poly Dubbing, #33 Orange Sulphur
Hackle: Light Blue Dun, tied parachute

Tying Tips: Easy to tie. Very straight forward. Post wing material can be substituted with any of your favorite materials. Body dubbing should not be altered. The sulfur hatch takes place in mid afternoon --- the sun will 'glisten' off the material.

Fishing Tips: Designed to be used during the *Ephemerella dorothea* hatch (sulfurs). Can be used whenever the duns or spinners are out.

Historical Note: I created this fly out of necessity. The standard patterns in the fly shops did not match the color of the sulfurs I was finding on the Au Sable River. I physically compared insects to tying materials on hand, in order to get a perfect match! The end result --- more fish in the creel!
