Recipe

Hook:	Daiichi #1180 Size 10-12
Thread:	Dark Brown, 6/0
Tail:	Moose Main, 4-5 fibers
Wing:	White Deer Body Hair, tied post
Body:	Dark Reddish-Brown deer hair, flared at the bend in the hook
Rib:	Crisscrossed thread
Hackle:	Dark Dun Saddle Hackle, tied parachute

Tying Tips: You may use your favorite dry fly hook. Make sure the deer hair goes all the way around the hook. Standard techniques, tied typical drake style. May be tied in sizes as small as #18.

Fishing Tips: Originally developed for the Isonychia hatch. It is also used for Ephemerella and Ephemera hatches. Josh Greenberg says you can use it all summer from June through September.

Historical Notes: This fly evolved from Rusty Gates original Rusty's Spinner. This fly was developed in the early 1990's. The recipe for the dyed deer hair body is a secret.

Tier: Tom Mills (Tom is a frequent tier for Gates Lodge).
